The Archdiocese of San Antonio has provided access to official sacramental records through the following websites. Certificates from sacramental records for persons deceased will **not** be created. Please do not contact the Archives or Parishes to request certificates for deceased persons.

Searching Ancestry.com for records for Archdiocese of San Antonio Records

In 2022, the Archdiocese of San Antonio's project with Ancestry.com was first made available. The sacramental records include Baptism and Confirmation records over 100 years up to 1930; Marriage records over 75 years up to 1960 and Death records over 25 years old up to 2004. Each year a new batch of images will be released that meet the open dates of the records until the final date.

- To search just our records, you will need to go to **Search/Card Catalog** and type in **Title: Archdiocese of San Antonio**.

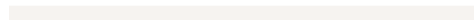
- You can either search by name and date or **Browse the Collection** and use the pull-down tab to select the parish records you want to search.

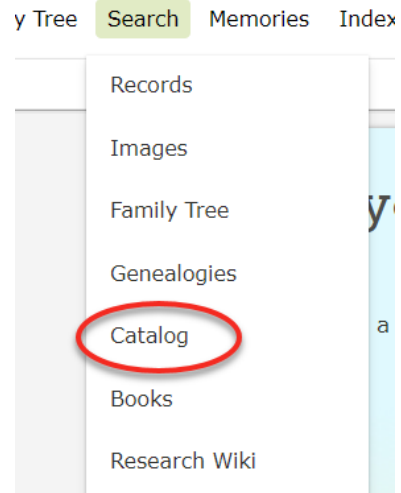


Searching Familysearch.org for Sacramental Records

Familysearch.org is a free website for genealogical research for which an account must be. The records available go up to approximately 1955.

To find the records, first sign in to familysearch.org.

1. Go to Search/Catalog
2. Type in the location (city, state) and then select on the appropriate link.
3. Select “Church Records”
4. Select appropriate church link.
5. Scroll down to find the microfilm related to the years you are looking for, then click on the “camera” icon.
6. Scroll the microfilm.
