Precatechumenate/Evangelization

So what's supposed to be going on during this period?

On RCIA Team's Part:

- Get to know the Inquirers
- > Answer preliminary questions
- Introduce Inquirers to the First Proclamation; (Gospel Message) Evangelization
- Give a simple personal testimony: How God has made a difference in your life
- > Introduce Inquirers to various forms of Prayer

On Participants' Part:

- > Inquire! Ask questions and participate
- **Show initial signs of conversion to Christ.**

164. ...[W]e have rediscovered the fundamental role of the first announcement or kerygma, which needs to be the center of all evangelizing activity ... The kerygma is Trinitarian. The fire of the Spirit is given in the form of tongues and leads us to believe in Jesus Christ who, by his death and resurrection, reveals and communicates to us the Father's infinite mercy. On the lips of the catechist the first proclamation must ring out over and over:

"Jesus Christ loves you; he gave his life to save you; and now he is living at your side every day to enlighten, strengthen and free you."

164. (Cont.)

This first proclamation is called "first" not because it exists at the beginning and can then be forgotten or replaced by other more important things. It is first in a qualitative sense because it is the principal proclamation, the one which we must hear again and again in different ways, the one which we must announce one way or another throughout the process of catechesis, at every level and moment.

165. We must not think that in catechesis the kerygma gives way to a supposedly more "solid" formation ...

All Christian formation consists of entering more deeply into the kerygma, which is reflected in and constantly illumines ... It is the message capable of responding to the desire for the infinite which abides in every human heart.

165. (Cont.) The centrality of the kerygma calls for stressing those elements which are most needed today:

- it has to express God's saving love which precedes any moral and religious obligation on our part;
- 2) it should not impose the truth but appeal to freedom;
- it should be marked by joy, encouragement, liveliness and a harmonious balance which will not reduce preaching to a few doctrines which are at times more philosophical than evangelical.

All this demands on the part of the evangelizer certain attitudes which foster openness to the message: approachability, readiness for dialogue, patience, a warmth and welcome which is non-judgmental.

Precatechumenate/Evangelization

- ► The term κήρυγμα, (ΚΕRYGMA) is Greek for "proclamation." Thus the Kerygma is what is proclaimed.
- As the Apostles began the work of preaching and proclaiming Christ, they proclaimed the essence of the Gospel the Kerygma.
- More extended teaching or instruction, Διδαχή, (DIDACHE) in Greek, would come later, after initial adherence to Christ.

So let's not be doing <u>DIDACHE</u> when we should be doing <u>KERYGMA</u> in the Precatechumenate

Precatechumenate/Evangelization - the Kerygma

The basic curricula of the kerygma is that:

- The human person is afflicted by sin, the origin of all conflict and suffering
- ✓ Jesus is the chosen Messiah of God, the one who was promised.
- ✓ Though he was crucified, He rose gloriously from the dead, appearing to his disciples.
- ✓ Having been exulted at the right hand of the Father through his ascension, he now summons all to him through the ministry of the Church.

This glorious Good News requires a response from us:

- We should repent of our sins accept and accept baptism.
- We can then live in the new life of grace and salvation which Christ offers.
- ✓ There is an urgent need to conform ourselves to Christ and tell others of this Good News.

Precatechumenate/Evangelization

Some important RCIA Team Skills

- -Forming Relationships: w/ God and with others in a way that invites authentic friendship?
- -Hospitality: Welcoming, openness, and generosity of spirit
- -Sincerity & Witness: Does how we act conform to what we believe? Are we faithful witnesses to Christ & the Gospel? Can we speak to our relationship with Christ?
- -Trust & Respect: Can we be trusted with personal and confidential information? Can we interact with inquirers very different from ourselves?
