Eligibility for access 401(a) funds after employment separation

If you are receiving quarterly statements from TIAA, you may be eligible to access funds within your Lay Pension account after your final pay has been issued. Please contact Lydia Washington, Staff Accountant at 210-734-1633 with questions related to Lay Pension. The attached flyer will provide information regarding lay pension vesting schedules as well as TIAA-CREF's contact information. If you are currently enrolled in benefits, please allow up to 14 days to receive a packet regarding COBRA. This information will be mailed to your home address so please confirm your contact information in Paylocity.

403(b) Plan - TIAA's Process for Coronavirus-related Distributions and Loans

If you participated in the 403(b) retirement plan, you may contact TIAA-CREF to learn about your options and to discuss hardship withdrawals. The CARES Act allows retirement plan participants to have greater access to funds if impacted by the coronavirus. Greater access is allowed for retirement plan 403b participants for coronavirus-related distributions, which are defined as a distribution or a loan if you are:

- a) Diagnosed with COVID-19 on a test approved by the CDC
- b) Whose spouse or dependent is described as above (a), or who experiences adverse financial consequences as a result of:
 - Being quarantined
 - Being furloughed, laid off or having work hours reduced as a result of the virus or disease
 - Being unable to work due to lack of childcare due to such virus or disease
 - Closing or reduced hours of business owned by such individual as a result of such virus or disease
- c) Other factors as determined by the Secretary of Treasury or his delegate
